rainbow crosswalk is a symbol of our shared focus on building connections and a sense of belonging, while valuing individual differences in Strathcona County.

Have you ever wondered how did the rainbow flag become a symbol of LGBTQ2S+ pride? The rainbow flag was designed by Gilbert Baker who was an openly gay activist in San Francisco in 1978. Baker, and the community, wanted to create a symbol free from stigma.

The original rainbow flag had eight colours with each of them representing something different. Red - life, Orange - healing, Yellow - sunlight, Green - nature, Violet - Spirit, Indigo - Serenity, Hot pink - sexuality, Turquoise - magic Now that you have learned a little history...look up and all around you!
